

WHAT TO BRING

EVERYTHING should have scouts name and troop number – “troop 69”

Clothing and Bedding

- Complete uniform
 - Khaki shirt
 - Neckerchief
 - No loose patches
- Sturdy Hiking Shoes
- Water activity shoes
 - Old tennis shoes work
- Extra underwear and socks
- Shorts (2 or more)
- Activity shirts (Troop 69 reds)
- extra T-shirts (5 total)
- swimsuit (2 suggested)
- Poncho or Raincoat
 - If disposable – bring 3
- Pajamas (dry clothes to sleep in)
- Sweatshirt and Jacket
- Sleeping bag (or sheets and blankets)
- Sleeping pad (Thermarest or similar)
- Hat

Optional

- Camera and film
- Sewing kit
- Pillow
- Stamps
- Pen and Pencil

Personal Gear

- Flashlight & extra batteries
 - (head lamps work well)
- Reusable water bottle
 - Do not bring disposable water bottles
- Sunblock
- Insect repellent
 - non-aerosol – pump only
- Spending money
 - For trading post
- Mess kit
 - Cup, bowl, plate
 - knife, fork, spoon
- Toothbrush and toothpaste
- Hand Towel
- Bath Towel
- Washcloth
- Comb, brush, and mirror
- Soap in container
- Day pack or school backpack
- Scout book

Also note:

Bring anything required for merit badges.

For example, Fishing pole, knife, extra money for shooting sports, etc.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

No food for in camp – food is not allowed in the tents

Raccoons will tear through tents to get at food

No electronic games in camp – allowed for the car ride

We will have a lock box for electronics

Also note:

No 'R' rated movies for the car ride

No pirated movies for the car ride

No rated M video games

No adult advisory music

No cell phones in camp – allowed for car ride

Leaders will carry cell phones at all times for emergencies

No shirts or hats with questionable logos or graphics.

No aerosol can of any kind

No AXE body spray

Do not bring non-approved Boy Scout pocket knife. If you don't have your Totin' Chip, you can't carry a knife.
